



Possession of Cannabis: The law if you are under 18 and what you need to know

Cannabis is a Class B drug and is an illegal substance.

Young People caught in possession may be arrested or be taken home by the police and interviewed at a later date under caution at a police station. Your home may also be searched for further evidence.

You might receive anything from a caution to having to go to court.

You could get a custodial sentence if convicted by a court for possession.



A conviction for possession of cannabis can have a negative impact on your life in the following ways:

- Travel Some countries such as America would not allow you to visit.
- Employment- Some jobs require checks to be made and your conviction might be disclosed.
- You would have a criminal record.

Using cannabis in public increases your risk of being caught in possession.
