

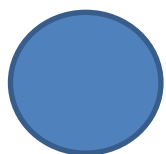
Dynamic Support Register (DSR) referral criteria for young people with a confirmed diagnosis of Autism and/or Intellectual Disability (Learning Disability)

The Dynamic Support Register provides a list of young people who may be at risk of admission to a mental health hospital or a 52-week specialist placement. The Key Working Team currently support young people, their families, carers and guardians who meet the BLUE, RED and Amber criteria on the DSR.

The DSR criteria is a clinical tool used to support a greater understanding of the young person's risk of admission to hospital, ensuring that the appropriate services and support are targeted to meet the needs of the young person and their family at a time when they most need it.

BLUE	Confirmed diagnosis of LD or ASC and: * In a Tier 4 mental health hospital.
RED	Confirmed diagnosis of LD or ASC and: * At immediate risk (within 48 hours) of admission to a Tier 4 mental health hospital or 52-week specialist or unregulated placement.
AMBER	Confirmed diagnosis of LD or ASC and: * discharge from a Tier 4 mental health hospital. * at imminent risk (within 2 weeks) of admission to a Tier 4 mental health hospital or 52-week specialist or unregulated placement. * breakdown in home placement that may lead to an inappropriate admission to Tier 4 mental health hospital or 52 week specialist or unregulated placement.
GREEN	Confirmed diagnosis of LD or ASC and: * risk of home placement breakdown alongside a significant escalation in need and support from statutory services (Health, Education and Social Care). * consideration that if YP needs are not met appropriately in the community, future admission to a Tier 4 Mental Health Hospital and/or 52 week specialist or unregulated placement may be considered

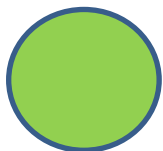
What does each RAG rating mean to you as the referrer?



Young people who are currently in a mental health (Tier 4) inpatient setting are rated category **BLUE**. These will be of the highest priority. A named Keyworker will be allocated from the Learning Disabilities and Autism Program Keyworker (LDAP) team to support the YP and their family or carer to work alongside the clinical team involved in their care with the overall aim of a planned discharge into the community with appropriate support.



Those young people identified as **RED** and **AMBER** will continue to be supported by the clinical team involved in their care. A named Keyworker will also be allocated from the LDAP team to support the YP, their family and or carer to ensure they receive the right support at a time when they need it with the aim of preventing an inappropriate admission to hospital (unless needed).



Young people identified as **GREEN** have no LDAP Keyworker allocated at this stage. The professionals involved will continue their work as usual with support from the community teams involved in the young person's journey. The YP has been added to the DSR as green to enable us to monitor the number of YP that are at risk of a potential hospital admission or 52-week placement and to be aware of those YP who may escalate to Amber or Red.

Should the risk increase for the YP, the professional team should contact the LDAP keyworker team and request a review of the RAG rating, to consider if the RED or AMBER criteria are now met and enable reconsideration as to whether the allocation of a Keyworker can be considered.
